**Subject:** Public Health and Other Legislation (Further Extension of Expiring Provisions) Amendment Bill 2021

Good afternoon members

The Public Health and Other Legislation (Further Extension of Expiring Provisions) Amendment Bill 2021 was passed by the Parliament yesterday, 2 September 2021.

Primarily, the Bill extends the operation of temporary legislative frameworks that are still required to respond to the impacts of the COVID-19 public health emergency until 30 April 2022, or an earlier date prescribed by regulation.

As you may be aware, the Bill further extends a range of temporary measures to protect the health, safety and welfare of persons in the community titles sector and to assist bodies corporate and owners suffering financial stress caused by the public health emergency.

These amendments will commence by assent.
